Please Take Notice that the **Liquidating Receiver’s and Plan Receiver’s Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement With Beacon Mutual Insurance Company and RI Department of Labor and Training (“Petition”)**, is scheduled for hearing at 12:00 pm on the 11th day of February, 2022, before the Honorable Brian P. Stern sitting in Providence County Superior Court, on the Providence County Business Calendar. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the hearing will be conducted remotely.
